MOBILE TRAFFIC GARDEN

The Mobile Traffic Garden is ready to roll to your school or youth program! We work with children ages preschool through 5th grade. We can set up for P.E. classes or for a period of time during a summer camp or other youth program day. We have scooters, balance bikes, and helmets available for use. Find more information at: https://ccacwa.org/mobile-traffic-garden/.

REQUIREMENTS

- Teachers/staff on site to provide class management and help with curriculum
- Staff/volunteers on site to help set up and reload traffic garden (at least two adults able to maneuver 75 lb. bags (Indoor traffic garden) or able to maneuver heavy, grubby turf and rubber mat pieces (outdoor traffic garden)
- Parking area available for van and 16' trailer near gym (indoor traffic garden) or outdoor space (outdoor traffic garden)
- Indoor traffic garden space minimum: 48' x 58'
- Outdoor traffic garden space minimum: 54' x 54'
- Outdoor traffic garden space needs to be a flat, paved area
- Outdoor traffic garden can be scheduled June through September and is contingent on dry weather



What is Coordinated Entry?

Coordinated Entry is an intake program that serves Thurston County residents experiencing homelessness. This program is not designed for immediate shelter or housing placements.

At your intake appointment you will complete a vulnerability assessment and discuss potential solutions, community resources, and eligibility for housing program referrals.


Child Find Notice
